This initiative is designed for any superintendent, central office leader, and/or central office team that has a passion to better support principals in the area of instructional leadership. By joining MCOI you will:

- Understand and begin to apply the current research and best practices on improving the performance of principals as instructional leaders.
- Understand and be able use tools and processes to work effectively with principals in one-on-one teaching and coaching relationships.
- Develop the routines and structures of successful learning communities to support their work together.

A great feature of this program is that you will do all of this learning side-by-side with colleagues from across the state. MCOI is specifically designed so that you will attend statewide program sessions as well as local cohort meetings with leaders from around your region. Session content includes:

- How to coach and provide feedback to principals to support improvement of instructional leadership practices.
- How to use data to gather evidence of continual progress of student learning and teaching and leadership practices
- How to observe and provide strength based feedback to colleagues on problems of principal supervisor practice.
